



Images of God

1. Give each student two or three 12”–15” pieces of aluminum foil and a small index card.
2. Invite them to use the aluminum foil to “sculpt” a symbol that speaks of God’s greatness, holiness, power, or mystery for them.
For example, they might shape their foil pieces into a sturdy tree trunk, as a sign that God is eternal.
3. After they have finished creating their sculptures, ask them to write on the index card a title for their work of art.
You might also want them to find an appropriate Scripture verse that expresses the theme of their sculpture. This can be written on the index card also.

Afterward, allow time for sharing and discussion. Display the students’ sculptures on a table in the classroom or in a more public area of the parish.
